



The Vest That Became a Hat

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This yarn was going to be a vest, until my bulldog ate it... and left me just enough yarn for this hat.

Gauge

14 sts = 4"

Materials

Yarn: OnLine Linie 208 Nature-Wool, 100g
OnLine Linie 209 Georgia, 50g

Needles: 16" Circular Size US #10 (6mm) or size needed for gauge

Notions: Stitch Marker

Abbreviations

K = Knit; **K2tog** = Knit 2 Together;

Instructions

Using Nature-Wool, cast on 72 stitches and join to work in the round, being careful not to twist. Place marker to indicate beginning of round.

Work 1" inches in seed stitch by repeating the following two rounds:

Rnd 1: (K1, P1) around.

Rnd 2: (P1, K1) around.

Change to stockinette.

Knit one round of Georgia, then knit 6 rounds of Nature-Wool. Repeat these seven rounds two more times.

Knit one round of Georgia.

Begin decrease rounds, alternating two-row stripes of Georgia with two-row stripes of Nature-Wool.

Rnd 1: (K6, K2tog) around.

Rnd 2: K

Rnd 3: (K5, K2tog) around.

Rnd 4: K

Rnd 5: (K4, K2tog) around.

Rnd 6: K

Rnd 7: (K3, K2tog) around.

Rnd 8: K

Rnd 9: (K2, K2tog) around.

Rnd 10: K

Rnd 11: (K1, K2tog) around.

Rnd 12: K

Rnd 13: K2tog around. 9 stitches remain.

Break yarn and thread through remaining stitches, draw up to close opening, and weave in tail on inside. Weave in other tails.

Make a generous tassel, using both yarns, and attach it to top of hat.
